



## Coping in Military Spouses Research Study

Meghan Monney, a member of the Army Engineer Spouses Club, is working on her Ph.D. in Nursing from the University of Texas Health San Antonio. Her dissertation will examine the coping of Army spouses during soldier deployment to a combat zone. The survey takes 20 minutes to complete. #### Slow Cooker Creamy Tomato Basil Tortellini Soup

1 3/4 cup diced carrots (3 medium)
1 3/4 cup diced yellow onion (1 large)
2 Tbsp olive oil
5 cloves garlic, minced
3 (28 oz) cans whole Roma tomatoes
1 (32 oz) carton vegetable broth
1/3 cup chopped fresh basil, extra for garnish
2 bay leaves
1 Tbsp granulated sugar
Salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste
16 oz refrigerated three cheese tortellini
3/4 cup heavy cream
Parmesan, shredded, for serving

Heat olive oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Add carrots and onion and saute 3-4 minutes, add garlic and saute 1 minute longer. Pour mixture into a 6 or 7 quart slow cooker along with tomatoes, vegetable broth, basil, bay leaves, sugar. Stir and season with salt and pepper to taste. Cover slow cooker and cook on LOW 6 -7 hours or HIGH 3 - 3 1/2 hours. Remove bay leaves then puree mixture well in small batches in a blender (only fill blender 2/3 full and cover removable insert with a kitchen towel) or us an emulsion blender\*. Stir in tortellini, cover and cook on HIGH heat 15 - 20 minutes longer (or until heated through). Reduce heat to warm, stir in heavy cream. Serve topped with parmesan cheese and fresh basil.

If your slow cooker doesn't keep all the moisture in well while cooking, you may need to add in 1/2 cup water or so to prevent the soup from becoming too thick.

## Culinary Corner

When the weather outside is cold and snowy, I love to make soup and hearty meals in my crockpot or slow cooker. Here are a few of my favorite finds from Pinterest.

#### Crock Pot Corn Chowder

2 cups potatoes, (peeled and cubed)
2 cups fresh or frozen corn
1 16-oz can creamed corn
6 slices bacon, (fried until crisp and crumbled)
1 tablespoon sugar
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
1 teaspoon seasoned salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 cup half and half ((can substitute chicken broth or cream, if desired))
additional crumbled bacon, (for serving)

Combine the potatoes, corn, creamed corn, bacon, sugar, Worcestershire sauce, seasoned salt and pepper in a slow cooker and cook on high for 3-4 hours. Add in the half and half and cook an additional 15-20 minutes, until heated through.

Serve topped with additional bacon, if desired.

#### In Remembrance

#### Colonel (R) Edward C. Gibson

COL (R) Edward C. Gibson, a recipient of the Gold de Fleury Medal and longtime supporter of the Engineer Regiment, passed away on December 26, 2021. He was 95 years old.

COL (R) Gibson honorably served his nation with almost 50 years of public service. He was a combat veteran of World War II, Korea, and Vietnam. After retiring from the military, he served for 20 years as the Chief of Military Personnel, Office of the Chief of Engineers. COL (R) Gibson continued to serve Engineers for nearly 30 years after retiring from the Civil Service through his non-profit organization, 21 Delta Search. 21 Delta Search was established to assist service members transitioning from the military to civilian careers.

In 2004, COL (R) Gibson received the U.S. Army Engineer Association Gold de Fleury Medal, the highest award given by the Engineer Regiment. He received the 2018 Golden Eagle Award from the Society of American Military Engineers. SAME honored Ed with creating the "Gibson Veteran Transition Medal," given in recognition to a SAME member for superior efforts in assisting military personnel as they transition to the private sector.

A memorial service and burial with military honors will be held at Arlington National Cemetery at a later date.

Our heartfelt condolences to Estelle, his spouse of 72 years, children Beth, Jim, and Clif, and their spouses, six grandchildren, and nine great-grandchildren.
