A CORPS EMPLOYEE WAS THE FIRST GOLD OLYMPIC WINNER

James Brendan Connolly (1868-1957) was the first winner of an Olympic Gold Medal, a veteran of the charge up San Juan Hill during the Spanish-American War, candidate for Congress in 1911 (Progressive Party), and one of America's foremost writers of maritime tales, having authored some 25 full-length works and more than 200 contributions to journals and newspapers. He also served with the Savannah District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Born in South Boston, Massachusetts, one of 12 children, Connolly came to Savannah in 1892 at the invitation of his brother Michael, who worked for the Savannah District and arranged a position for James. In the next three years, James served in various positions, including clerk, recorder of tidal and river current fluctuations, pile-driver inspector, and dredge inspector. Connolly liked the district engineer, Capt. Oberlin Carter, who moved Connolly to rivers and harbors work after he became bored with a clerk's duties. Connolly enjoyed himself in Savannah, where he indulged in many athletic events, including track meets and football. He captained the Catholic Library Association football team to a 36-0 win over the Young Hebrew Association, scoring three touchdowns himself. For a while, he also wrote the sports column for a new weekly paper called the *Lamplight.*

In 1895 Connolly was ready for new adventures. He had never graduated from high school but took correspondence courses for six months and, encouraged by Dean Nathaniel Shaler of Harvard University, passed Harvard's entrance examination in October 1895. He entered the university as a 27-year-old freshman but left it within a year—despite being told he might not be readmitted—to participate in the first modern Olympic games, held in Athens, Greece. Harvard's attitude offended him, and he never returned to complete his education there.

In Athens, Connolly won the gold medal (actually, silver medals were then awarded for first place) in the triple jump despite the fact that the triple jump in Athens was two hops and a jump rather than the hop, skip, and jump for which Connolly had trained and was the American champion. He threw his cap a yard beyond the mark set by his main competitor and then managed to leap even beyond the cap, just short of 13.5 meters, a mark that was short of his personal best and also of the world record he would set later that year. It was the first place medal awarded in modern Olympic history. Connolly also won second place in the high jump and third place in the long jump.

Some fifty years later, Harvard awarded Connolly a Harvard sports letter, perhaps a belated apology for not encouraging him to return to finish his education. By that time, he was a well-known author (even having lectured on literature at Harvard), war correspondent, novelist, and short-story writer. But his own autobiography testifies to those halcyon and no doubt formative years that he spent as a young man in Savannah.

THE GOLD CASTLE PIN

On June 17, 2006, the wife of the 51st US Army Chief of Engineers, Julie Strock, was presented with a small box tied nicely with a bow. The smallness of the box indicated that it *HAD* to be something very special. INDEED!

Within the box was a beautiful gold Castle Pin and a small note. The Castle Pin was intricately carved and had 3 brilliant diamonds in it. The note within read:

"June 17, 2006

This 14kt gold Castle with 3 small diamonds is presented to the wife of the 51st Chief of Engineers, U.S. Army in recognition of the valuable role and services of the wives of serving Chiefs of Engineers.

This "Castle" is to be worn at the pleasure of the serving wife who will pass it to her successor as a new Chief of Engineers takes office.

Should a future Chief of Engineers be a woman, the "Castle" should be hers to wear as appropriate.

Should the Chief of Engineers be a bachelor, the Castle should then be retained by the President AEOWC, until there is a Mrs. Chief.

As one may recall, the Chief of Engineers wears the 14kt gold Castle Engineer Branch pins, which belonged to Douglas MacArthur. How fitting for the wife of the Chief to be honored with a gold Castle! Since the penning of the note and the presentation of the pin, more treasured facts have emerged.

The pin was a loving act of the 44th Chief of Engineers (July 1, 1976 to September 30, 1980), LTG John W. "Jack" Morris, as a means of honoring the service and legacy of his beloved wife, Gerri (former Army nurse and accomplished Army wife).


Mrs. Strock (Julie) wore the pin and humbly presented it to Paula VanAntwerp, wife of the 52nd Chief of Engineers. Paula wore the pin humbly and honorably until the VanAntwerps' retirement on June 17, 2011. Since there was no confirmed Chief of Engineers to follow LTG VanAntwerp, MG Bo Temple stepped up as Acting Chief of Engineers. Nancy Temple assumed safekeeping possession of the pin until the confirmation of the 53rd Chief of Engineers.

On June 2, 2012, Nancy presented the gold Castle pin to Renee Bostick at the Army Engineer Spouses Club board meeting. Today, Mrs. Bostick not only has the honor of serving as the Chief's wife, but also has the privilege of preserving the legacy of the gold Castle pin.
