

## WHAT IS an HONORARY ADVISOR?

Advisors are generally spouses of the Command's senior leadership (military or civilian). These 'seasoned' spouses have valuable military life/life experiences and are invited and willing volunteers to offer guidance to private organizations and to be actively involved in the organization's events. Should the spouse of a senior leader be unable to volunteer, a willing volunteer may be asked to serve in that position.

Honorary advisors are not required to pay annual dues and, if not paying dues, have all privileges of membership except voting and holding office.

The role of an advisor, when needed, is to assure compliance with existing Army/Installation regulations and/or restrictions for private organizations, to interject alternative ideas, to stimulate thought, and to be a cheerleader for the private organization, which supports the military unit. The advisor supports the final decisions made by the club.

## WHO ARE AESC's Honorary Advisors?

Our AESC Constitution (Article IV. OFFICERS, Section 2. Honorary Advisors) identifies the USACE senior leader spouses who may be invited to serve as Honorary Advisors to the club.

## Around Town

Hains Point is at the southern tip of East Potomac Park, and offers beautiful views of the Potomac River, Anacostia River, and the Washington Channel. Surrounded by beautiful greenery



and trees, the area is a popular destination for a delightful picnic and relaxation. Hains Point Picnic Areas are a convenient spot to have a picnic near the water. Other popular activities on Hains Point include fishing, bicycling, running, and playtime for the kids on the playground.

Hains Point is named in memory of Peter Conover Hains, Major General, United States Army, who is buried in Arlington National Cemetery. He designed the Tidal Basin in Washington, D.C., thus solving the drainage problems and foul smell of most of the Washington area marshlands. He served as the chief engineer for the Norfolk Harbor and River District and then as chief engineer

for the Eastern Division. He left active duty in the Fall of 1918.

Hains was the oldest officer to serve on active duty since Major General John E. Wool retired in 1863 at the age of 79. He was also, probably, the only person to serve on active duty with the U.S. Army in both the American Civil War and the First World War.

General Hains died at Walter Reed Hospital in 1921 and was buried in Arlington National Cemetery.



# Do You Know...


The Directorate of Civil Works is a major component of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. The Civil Works programs include water resource development activities including flood risk management, navigation, recreation, and infrastructure and environmental stewardship. Their mission also includes emergency response.



On September 1, 2016 leaders from the ASA(CW), White House NEC, USACE and The Port Authority of NY & NJ (PANYNJ) gathered in Bayonne NJ with various dignitaries and elected officials to celebrate the completion of NY/NJ Harbor Deepening. COL Dave Caldwell and the USACE New York District partnered with the PANYNJ to put on this event with over 200 people in attendance, the USMA Hellcat band, and a neo-panama ship and container terminal in the background. Five Congressional Members and other dignitaries lauded USACE's delivery of the \$2.1B project with global and National significance, \$800M in cost savings, and beneficial use of dredged materials to enhance the environment.



This ceremony officially recognized that the Port of New York and New Jersey can support shipping vessels requiring 50 feet of draft. This is a significant accomplishment for the Corps of Engineers and our Nation as the Panama Canal has been recently widened so it can pass these large vessels - called Post-Panamax or New Panamax. Larger container ships will now call on ports all along the East Coast of the North America due to this canal widening. The Port of New York and New Jersey join the Ports of Baltimore, Norfolk (Hampton Roads), and Miami as other ports that support ships needing 50 feet of draft. The Port of Charleston has been approved to deepen their harbor to 52 feet with construction starting in the next few years.

## SGT Strait's Cobb Dip

### Ingredients

- ♥ 8 oz. cream cheese, softened
- ♥ 1 c. sour cream
- ♥ 1 package Hidden Valley Ranch Dip mix
- ♥ 1 c. chopped Romaine lettuce
- ♥ 1 Roma tomato, chopped
- ♥ ½ c. shredded cheddar cheese
- ♥ ½ c. grilled corn
- ♥ ¼ c. bacon, cooked & crumbled
- ♥ ¼ c. blue cheese crumbles

### Instructions

1. Combine cream cheese, sour cream, and Ranch Dip mix and mix until smooth.
2. Spread into the bottom of a 9-inch pie plate or other similarly sized pan.
3. Top with lettuce, tomatoes, cheddar cheese, corn, bacon, and blue cheese.
4. Enjoy with your favorite tortilla chips, crackers, or pita chips.


